


Never forget the Nebraska **Constitution states**

KNOW THE UNICAMERAL

Nebraska is a unicameral and has only one legislative body.

- We have 49 senators and we the people are the second house of the Legislature.
- This means we have opportunities for input and advocacy that many states don't have so it is important to take advantage of them.



BILL TO LAW

- Each bill goes to committee and gets a hearing.
- You can give testimony as support, oppose, or neutral.
- If the bill gets out of committee it gets 3 rounds of debate.
- In the last round senators vote on whether to send the bill to the governor.
- The governor can sign or veto the bill.
- A veto override needs 30 votes.

BETTER ELECTIONS



Makes simple but powerful changes to improve voting.

- Makes Election Day a state holiday.
- Makes voter registration through DMV automatic with the option to optout.
- Adds prepaid postage to the return envelopes for vote by mail ballots.



RESTORATION



Address the current practice of disenfranchising people with felony convictions.

- LB158 removes the additional two-year waiting period on voting.
- LR1oCA ends the
 disenfranchisement of
 people with felony
 convictions altogether.





FAIR REDISTRICTING



Redistricting affects what issues are handled and what issues are ignored.

 Requires districts be drawn politically neutral without consideration of political affiliation, previous voting data, and voter demographics.





IMPROVED VOTE BY MAIL




Makes voter-friendly improvements to vote by mail in Nebraska.

- Allows voters to request to be added to a permanent vote by mail list.
- Allows voters to request their vote by mail online.









VOTER ID



Puts disenfranchisement at the heart of Nebraska's constitution.

- Suppresses votes of Black and Brown, differently abled, elderly, and rural voters
- Promotes the myth of voter fraud
- Wastes millions of taxpayer dollars.





CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION



Resolution to Congress for an Article V convention of the states to propose amendments to the United States Constitution.

 Could overturn voting rights, the right to privacy, and the court's role in protecting minority rights.




WINNER-TAKE-ALL



Changes Nebraska's
Electoral College allocation
to a winner-take-all system.

 More Nebraskans have a voice in our current system. The winner of the popular vote in each congressional district receives 1 elector and the state-wide popular vote winner receives 2.




TALKING TO OFFICIALS



Tips

- Be clear about what you want and ask for something concrete.
- Use the power of your personal story.
- Be polite to the official and their staff.
- Keep reaching out! It's their job to listen.





IN PERSON TESTIMONY

You can come to the legislature in person.

- Testimony is generally limited to 5 minutes.
- At the beginning say and spell your name and whether you support or oppose the bill.
- Then explain why you are in opposition or in favor.
- Remember we are available to help you prepare your testimony.





WRITTEN TESTIMONY

For anyone concerned about the safety of testifying in person you have the option to turn in written testimony.

- Your testimony will be included as if you had testified in person.
- YOU must bring 12 copies
 of your testimony to the
 committee room where
 the hearing is set to take
 place between 8:30 and
 9:30 am CST.




EMAILED POSITION LETTERS

If you can't be in person emailing a position letter is the most effective method to share your voice. To be part of the public record, your email must include:

- Your name and address
- Your position for or against the measure
- A sentence requesting that your letter be included in the record.

Please email your position letter to the committee's email no later than noon CT the business day before the hearing.





ONLINE COMMENTS

NebraskaLegislature.gov allows written comments. While not considered testimony or part of the public record, the comments can be accessed by senators and staff.

- Use "Search Current Bills" in the top right corner to find the bill you want to comment on.
- Online comments should be no more than a few sentences long.
